BACKGROUND & RATIONALE

The Mediterranean Basin is one of the regions most exposed to environmental hazards, such as earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, floods, fires and droughts. These hazards affect most sectors and ecosystems, including water, food, health and security. Climate change is a threat to us all, amplifying the frequency and intensity of these hazards and putting additional pressure on vulnerable ecosystems, communities and economies. Currently, the basin is in a state of constant change due to human activities such as uncontrolled land and sea use, urbanisation and rapid industrial development, as well as being home to one of the world's busiest shipping routes. All these factors point to significant and increasing risks in the coming decades. To meet these challenges, our interconnected world needs to build bridges today more than ever to help us find workable solutions together that leave no one behind. Higher education and its links to research and innovation play a crucial role in individual and societal progress and in providing the highly skilled workforce that Europe and neighboring countries need to create jobs, improve quality of life and move towards sustainable development.

OBJECTIVES

The general objective of the MediCoRe initiative is to consolidate the MediCoRe Partnership by bringing Mediterranean institutions together under the Mediterranean Community Resilience framework, which is coordinated by **POLIBA-DICATEch**. The initiative aims to strengthen cooperation in joint research, encourage the development of innovative educational services and promote technology transfer activities across the Mediterranean region. By taking these steps, MediCoRe seeks to empower current and future generations of Mediterranean students, researchers and professionals, enabling them to play a leading role in the ongoing process of socio-economic and environmental development. The initiative also aims to raise awareness among Mediterranean decision-makers and enhance their capacity, encouraging them to make strategic choices that support intelligent, inclusive and sustainable growth. This vision is grounded in ecological principles and inspired by the paradigm of the circular and responsible management of Mediterranean resources. The main objective of the MediCoRe Side Event is to open a dialogue on perspectives, opportunities and future directions for Mediterranean cooperation in addressing critical challenges relating to water resource management, supply and security, as well as other interconnected environmental, social and economic issues affecting the region. Attention will be devoted to identifying collaborative approaches, sharing best practice and exploring innovative solutions that can strengthen resilience, sustainability and regional integration across the Mediterranean basin.

TARGET AUDIENCE

The initiative targets public decision-makers and policymakers at local, regional, national and Mediterranean levels, as well as water authorities and utility managers responsible for water resource planning and management, environmental agencies and regulatory bodies, and development practitioners and technical experts working on climate adaptation and resilience initiatives.

The key targets of the initiative are also students (undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD) from Mediterranean universities and research institutions; early-career researchers and scientists working on environmental sustainability, water resources, climate change, the circular economy and resilience; academic staff and educators; and young professionals and innovators interested in sustainable development and technological solutions to challenges facing the Mediterranean region.

The final beneficiaries of the initiative are Mediterranean communities exposed to water scarcity, drought, floods, pollution and climate-related risks; future generations who will benefit from improved environmental governance and sustainable resource management; and economic sectors that depend on natural resources, such as agriculture, tourism, energy and fisheries.

EXPECTED OUTCOMES

The session is expected to:

- Strengthen dialogue and cooperation among Mediterranean institutions and stakeholders on water resources management and supply.
- Identify shared challenges, priorities, and opportunities related to water scarcity, climate change, environmental risks, and sustainable and resilient resource management.
- Facilitate the exchange of good practices, research findings, and new technological and governance solutions.

- Foster stronger links between higher education, research and innovation, policymakers, public authorities, and the private sector.
- Promote opportunities for joint research, education, capacity building, technology transfer, and future collaborative initiatives within the MediCoRe Partnership.
- Enhance the capacity and engagement of students, young researchers, and professionals in addressing the Mediterranean's environmental and socio-economic challenges.
- Contribute to a shared vision for a more resilient, sustainable, inclusive, and integrated Mediterranean region.
